San Francisco Performances' PIVOT Festival is driven by a philosophy of innovation, creativity, and artistic excellence that pushes the boundaries of the traditional concert experience.

Composer/singer-songwriter **Gabriel Kahane** returns as guest curator once again for the tenth season of PIVOT. He is a musician and storyteller whose work exists at the intersection of art and social practice, and and is one of the most thoughtful — and thought-provoking — artists of his generation. He will perform opening night and host all three evenings of deliciously ingenious music brimming with thought, humor — both dark and light — and substance.

Composer, collaborator, violinist, singer, improviser, educator, and instigator **Carla Kihlstedt** explores complex worlds — the ocean, dreams, imaginary creatures, the machine age — through many different lenses. Kahane will lead her and the **Del Sol Quartet** in Kihlstedt's *26 Little Deaths*, inspired by Edward Gorey's *The Gashlycrumb Tinies*.
